In addition, the leaders of the U.S., Japan and South Korea presented a united front on the occasion of their historical trilateral summit at Camp David last August. They said, "We reaffirm our commitment to the complete denuclearization of North Korea in accordance with relevant UN resolutions and urge North Korea to abandon its nuclear and ballistic missile programs.

Against this backdrop, it would be meaningful to hear of what is going on the Korean peninsula including South Korea's strategy and plan to bring peace to the peninsula, major power's stances and EU's role. In addition, it could be a timely occasion to hear of the meaning of the spirit and principle of Camp David summit.
