Within space, he has organised several bilateral networking activities and maintains a continuous dialogue with Swedish and German space representatives at political, academic and corporate level. Mr. Ågren's diplomatic career started at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Stockholm in 2018, where he was working with EU trade policy. Before, he was a consultant at Business Sweden in Berlin, supporting Swedish and German companies. Dr. Adam Bower (PhD, University of British Columbia, Canada) is a Senior Lecturer (Associate Professor) in International Relations at the University of St Andrews in Scotland. He is the founding co-director of the Centre for Global Law and Governance and sits on the Steering Committee of the Institute for Legal and Constitutional Research. He is also a member of the St Andrews Centre for Exoplanet Science and a Fellow of the Outer Space Institute, a global network of transdisciplinary space experts focusing on space security and sustainability. Dr Bower's research explores the interaction of international law and political power in shaping outcomes in global politics, with a particular emphasis on the development and efficacy of norms regulating armed violence in areas ranging from conventional weapons disarmament to outer space security. His research has been published in leading academic journals and with Oxford University Press.

She is author or editor of six books, including International Cooperation Against All Odds: The Ultrasocial World (Oxford University Press, Fall 2023), The Politics of Crisis in Europe (Cambridge University Press, 2017) and Security Integration in Europe: How Knowledge-based Networks are Transforming the European Union (University of Michigan Press, 2011), which is the 2012 winner of the Best Book Prize from the University Association of Contemporary European Studies. She holds a PhD in Politics from Princeton University, and a bachelor's degree in Government from Harvard University. She is also a member of the Council on Foreign Relations.

ENGELHARD, Hila

Mrs. Hila Engelhard is a career diplomat serving as Minister-Counsellor, Head of the department for Economic & Scientific Affairs at the Embassy of Israel in Germany.
